

Description	This is a SUPREME source for UDHR lesson plans and materials. It has around 50 pages of lesson plans based on various HR themes such as “social and cultural wellbeing” and “development and the environment.” Following each activity, the source states which article(s) of the UDHR and the CRC apply to the activity. To access a table of contents, click on Ch.1 of the source. To access lesson plans for high school students, click on Ch.3.

Description	Amnesty provides a number of lesson plans on HR in general and also lesson plans geared toward specific issues. The lesson plans are detailed, thorough, and creative. Some of them are suggested for middle school, but they may be worth adjusting to apply to high school curriculum.

Description	This manual provides several activities for exploring Human Rights and the UDHR. This manual also includes copies of the UDHR [unabridged and simplified] and various resources for developing HRE committees and workshops for educators. Part 4 discusses activities for secondary schools.
Time	The activities range in length from 45 minutes to 90 minutes
Grade Level(s)	Secondary school (doesn't specify particular grade level therein)
Articles of UDHR	Most activities discuss all articles in the declaration generally. "Active listening" deals with article 19. "Vesna's Story" and the following activities deal with article 2. There are multiple activities based on gender inequality (article 1). "Action Roleplays" discusses 2, 6, 7, 13 19, 20, 23, 24.

Description	This resource has 3 activities that introduce the UDHR: Human Rights Collage (p.17), Creating a Country (p. 18), and Comparing the Bill of Rights with the UDHR (p.20). It also has lesson plans that deal with particular articles of the UDHR (part 3.0).
Time	The activities range in length from 45 minutes to 2 class periods.
Grade Level(s)	Secondary school (doesn't specify particular grade level therein).
Articles of UDHR	The 3 introductory activities have students look at all (or at least most) articles. Topic 3.1 Environment deals with article 25. Topic 3.2 Poverty deals with 18, 19, 20, & 25. Topic 3.3 Discrimination deals mainly with 2. Topic 3.4 Children's Education and Health deals with 26. Topic 3.5 Law and Justice looks at articles 6-7.
